Usability Testing



Usability Results - The Good!

- Clear search functionality and good advanced search
- Good level of detail and breadth on the monument descriptions page
- Map search function is considered very useful
- Good text resize option

Usability Results – The Bad (medium priority)



- Limited use of images too 'texty'
- Basic search box did not stand out
- No 'back' or 'back to top' buttons on the results page
- Order of full description information confusing and Important information does not stand out in text
- Icons used are not clickable
- Information is not clearly expandable within the full description

Usability Results – The Ugly (high priority)



- Initial search parameters were not clear
- Unclear and unexplained icons
- Map search is not linked from within the advanced search
- Not easy to identify specific results from within the results list
- Text searching is intolerant/inflexible
- Most appropriate search results are not listed first in the list

So what have we done about it?

- Corrected all the easily resolved issues quick wins
- Addressed as many of the more complex issues that resources, time and scope would allow
- Added explanatory information to manage expectations
- Informed future development for when the Public GIS Toolkit is available
